Total allocation for the year = £16,500

Objective one: Engaging all pupils in regular physical activity and improve mental wellbeing

Planned actions	Funding allocated	Impact
Break and lunchtime play leaders/games – Awards, T-shirts, badges	£500	To get children fitter and more physically active. Increase self-confidence and esteem and emotional wellbeing and lower anxiety. To develop lunchtimes to make them as active as possible. Giving the children a varied range of opportunities. Developing body strength.
Participation in increased number of sports competitions, including inclusive competitions and inter sport competitions.	£800	Greater participation of children in sporting events. Increase awareness of healthy sports. Increase mental wellbeing and increase confidence.

Objective two: Ensure high quality PE lessons take place

Planned actions	Funding allocated	Impact
Update PE equipment.	£2,000	Correct resources to ensure high quality PE lessons can take place.
Provide additional swimming lessons to ensure children not only in Upper Key Stage 2 can have high quality swimming lessons to ensure all children meet the national curriculum standard by the end of year 6	£2,000	Enhance the provision because not all children can access swimming lessons outside of school. Children have the best possible chance to meet requirements. A lot of children missed out on swimming during the pandemic, increasing swimming opportunities to address this issue.

Objective three: Increased confidence, knowledge and skills of all staff in teaching PE and Sport

Planned actions	Funding allocated	Impact
Real PE/LEGACY support level agreement	£1,600	Staff will gain more confidence in teaching PE which will impact on children's learning. Improve staff knowledge, confidence and subsequent quality of teaching, which will allow for the children to have a greater learning experience in PE.

Objective four: Broader experience of a range of sports and activities offered to all pupils

Planned actions	Funding allocated	Impact
Expand on Forest School activities	£2,000	Children given the chance to be more active and enjoying activities outside.
Participation in more intra sports competitions to offer a wider range of sporting activities.	£5,600	Children have the chance to access sports they would not normally have the chance to participate in. Children will increase in confidence to give all sports a try.

Objective five: Increased participation in competitive sport

Planned actions	Funding allocated	Impact
Forge greater links with other small schools to offer competitive games. Link with Northamptonshire Sports and local sport companies such as Northampton Saints and Northampton Town Football Club.	£1,000	More children have participated in competitive sporting events. More children being physically active
